

PLYMOUTH'S NEW ORGAN.

Historic Instrument, Rebuilt, Retains Its Former Appearance.

After having been under reconstruction for nearly a year and brought up to the highest standard of repair, the organ formerly used in Plymouth Church will be opened again with a concert by Ruth Wheeler, the organist of the church, and Edward Henry Warren, of Manhattan, tomorrow night. Because to-day is one of the anniversary days of the church, commemorating the general festival in Plymouth, and the day on which several new members are joyously taken in, the church has decided to give a concert after some public entertainment.

The new organ was given to Edward Wheeler, who built the organ to St. Bartholomew's and to Plymouth Church, Manhattan. It was built by Mr. Skinner's work Scott Wheeler, the organist of the church, and it is the same as the old one in every particular. Although the new organ has been in process of reconstruction for nearly a year, Mr. Wheeler, who has given to every detail his personal attention and supervision, says that it is one of the finest pieces of his kind ever done. Much of the instrument had to be taken to pieces, and for six months the work was done in the factory there. For the last six months two sets of men have been at work in Plymouth Church, by day and the other by night. Mr. Wheeler, the organist, has carefully watched the reconstruction of the organ from the time the first part was taken out to the time when the last reconstruction of the result instrument was made. He is familiar with every part of the instrument as it stands to-day. So it is that he will have an intimate knowledge of and familiarity with his instrument, which it is the great fortune of few organists to have. Speaking of the organ yesterday, Mr. Wheeler said:

Plymouth has today a rare, modern organ, which contains features hitherto unknown in this country. It is an instrument of four manuals and fifty-four speaking stops. It has beautiful lights, pipes and decorative work, and it is a masterpiece of art. The organ is a masterpiece of art, and it is the same as the old one in every particular.
